# **OUR COMMITMENT TO SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT**

Our Strategic Plan communicates the strategic direction of our school over the next three years. This plan brings together an overview of the strategic intent of the school for maximizing its performance across the 5 areas of the School Improvement and Accountability Framework. This Strategic Plan forms part of a suite of documents including annual Operational Plans, Workforce Management Plan, National Quality Standard Plan, and curriculum area plans. The key mechanism for our school to demonstrate accountability is through school self-assessment, school planning and school reporting.

In term 1 2019 Pingelly PS underwent its first review as part of the Department of Education's new Public School Review Process. Through this process our performance was reviewed across the 5 domains of the School Improvement and Accountability Framework as well as analysis of student achievement and progress. Pingelly PS received an School Performance Rating of Needs Improvement. It was noted that significant improvement across the Relationships and Learning environment domains had taken place in preparation for targeted strategic planning for the remaining performance domains. The 2019-2021 Strategic Plan and supporting school improvement documents provide the strategies for improvement across these domains.
