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Dear PPS Families,

As we reach the end of an unusual and challenging semester, my hope is that during this holiday break, everyone gets a much needed rest. Take care and make the most of catching up on the things we couldn't do last holidays.

COVID-19 Update

WA has responded remarkably well to the COVID-19 pandemic and recently commenced phase 4 of the WA Roadmap. Phase 5 of the WA Roadmap is planned to commence on Saturday, 18th July with a relaxation of additional restrictions coming into effect ready for term 3.

Until phase 5 is introduced, the following hygiene and social distancing measures apply:

- Hygiene practices handwashing, hygiene messages etc. will continue similar to term 2
- Cleaning during school hours will continue for the duration of term 3
- Events such as assemblies, faction and interschool sports and incursions and excursions can recommence. Adult attendance is in line with physical distancing requirements of one adult per two square metres
- Parents/caregivers can continue to drop off and collect children from school grounds, however at this stage, advice is that parents/caregivers refrain from entering classrooms to ensure compliance with physical distancing requirements of one adult per two square metres
- P&C and School Council meetings can occur in accordance with physical distancing requirements of one adult per two square metres

As a result of these restrictions being relaxed, our updated term 3 and 4 planner is now available on our website reflecting any changes to dates and events. To familiarise yourself with our website, see the next page of the newsletter.

The introduction of phase 5 of the WA Roadmap is proposed to commence prior to the beginning of term 3. Once schools have been notified of the changes to operations, I will communicate this to the school community. This will occur on the Monday prior to students returning to school.

Semester 1 Reports

Semester 1 reports were sent home with all students K – 6 yesterday afternoon. As communicated earlier, semester 1 reports looked different due to the COVID-19 and learning at home impact. The major impact was the removal of grades and comments for some learning areas, with teachers reporting on effort across learning areas. Parent/teacher meetings have been taking place across the week providing a great opportunity for parents/caregivers to discuss their child's progress with their classroom teacher.

Staff Update

We are all looking forward to Mr Cowcher's return to Pingelly PS next term. He has thoroughly enjoyed his time at Wandering PS, but is excited to be coming back. Thanks to Mr Steel for assuming Deputy Principal duties for the second half of this term.

Faction Cross Country

With the reintroduction of events, our faction cross country will take place on Wednesday, 22nd July. This year's faction cross country will be run at the school, with a challenging, all-terrain course mapped out for students. At this stage, parents/ caregivers can attend to spectate in accordance with physical distancing requirements. If phase 5 comes into effect prior to the term 3 commencing, then this may see a removal of the 2 square metre rule assisting with the management of helpers and spectators.

Student Health

Thank you to parents/caregivers for your ongoing support with keeping sick children at home. We have definitely seen a decrease in winter sicknesses largely attributed to increased hygiene awareness and practices, and other social distancing measures. In keeping the message consistent, it is important to keep in mind that any child reporting cold or flu like symptoms needs to stay at home. If a student informs their teacher of similar symptoms, parents / caregivers will be notified and required to collect their child. This also applies to staff and other adults. If sick, please remain off school grounds.

 Only a few, won't do any harm.


Now that we've informed you on what the staff are doing, perhaps when we all get back to school, not all of us will be booing.


Year 2/3 - T & E


