NAIDOC DAY

Yesterday's NAIDOC Day celebration was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who attended. The day was organised by our Aboriginal Education Officer, Mrs Kristy Jetta, together with the assistance of Mrs Moulton.

The whole school assembly began with the *Welcome to Country* by Tanika B. The *Australian National Anthem* then followed.

Mrs Jetta gave a short address to the school, which was then followed by the K/PP singing two beautiful songs in Noongar language - "Wanjoo" (welcome) and "Twinkle, twinkle". The year 1/2 and 2/3 classes followed with a beautiful song about the 6 noongar seasons - "Bibbulumun Bonar"

The Year 3/4 class dramatized two Aboriginal legends "Echidna Finds a Friend" and "How the Birds got their Colours", with students reading the text and acting out the plays, while Mrs Jetta interpreted the story into Noongar language.

A very thought provoking play was then performed by the Year 5/6 class. The class wrote and produced the play "The Life of Britt" which supports the Ngamari Free campaign about smoking and the effect it has on our health and wellbeing.

For the Grand Finale, the school choir (including Ms Goodlad), conducted by Mrs Moulton and accompanied by Ms Gale on guitar, performed "We are Australian", with the intro being performed in Noongar language.

Once the assembly concluded, Ms Christine Townsend from the Peel Harvey Catchment Council and Ms Darralyn Ebsary, Deputy Chair of the HPCC board, presented Numbats to the winners of the colouring competition. We thank them very much for attending and participating in our NAIDOC ceremony.

Some delicious traditional tucker was then provided by Mrs Jetta's family for everyone to enjoy.

A huge THANK YOU to EVERYONE who was involved in the day and assisted in making it such a fabulous event.
