

On Wednesday the 25<sup>th</sup> August 2021 our class had an opportunity to take a trip to the new Perth Museum Boorla Bardip. When we arrived, we met Tom who was our guide for the Noongar experience. We learnt about the importance of storytelling and the different ways stories are shared through a range of cultural practices including sand,





wooden carvings, digging sticks and tapping sticks We also learnt about the Seven Sisters. After viewing the Ngalang Koort Boodja Wirn Gallery we went to the Wild Life gallery on the third floor and spent time discovering nature's diversity and the relationships between the people, plants and animals and how communities are working to protect and sustain these ecosystems. We smelt things, we felt things and looked at lots and lots of interesting ancient fossils, rare specimens and live creatures, it was so awesome! We then went to the Connections Gallery whilst still on the third floor and learnt about Western Australia's expansive landscape and the historical, geological, natural and cultural connections we have to other parts of Australia and to the rest of the world. There was so much to see and we ran out of time, but we did get to look at some of the other galleries including the Changes, Origins and the Stan Perron WA Treasures galleries before having to head home.
