## Congratulations to Annalyce Page winner of the Vi Barham Award for Excellence



Vi Barham was known as the "Mother of Education" for the Upper Great Southern Region. From 1963, Mrs Barham worked tirelessly and diligently as a School Regional Office Secretary, giving 23 years of service for the children of the region.

A most loyal and dedicated worker Mrs Barham always worked exceptionally hard with a positive disposition, continually delivering excellence, as well as being a warm and fine lady.

Pingelly Primary School was extremely proud of our Year 6 student *Annalyce Page*, who was the recipient of the very prestigious *Vi Barham Award for Excellence* at the Vi Barham Award Night in Narrogin recently.

The Vi Barham Award has been presented each year since 1987, and it is the first time that it has been presented to a student from Pingelly PS. Nominees for the award have to be achieving a high level of excellence in academics and demonstrate participation in co-curricular activities such as sport, art, music, drama or community and cultural events. The student has to be in Year 6 and currently enrolled at a participating school. Twenty nine schools participate from within the Upper Great Southern Region.


Pingelly Primary School identified two very worthy nominees, Imogen Watts and Annalyce Page.
