School Development Days

Early this term, the school held a Staff Development Day where we participated in the next Modules of Berry Street Educational Model. BSEM provides educators with a toolkit of practical strategies for immediate use in the classroom and across your school. These help us meet the needs of students by:

- understanding the benefits of trauma-informed teaching on child development and ability to learn
- creating a supportive and trauma-informed positive education classroom
- bolstering student-teacher relationships
- applying positive relational classroom behaviour management strategies
- instilling strengths-based practices across the school.

We are learning strategies to keep students engaged and how to support them to have an improved capacity for school achievement.

On the 31st May we have invited local schools to attend our school and participate in a Writing Moderation and Planning day. Teachers will use this moderation to invite collaborative discussion on design of the writing program. Moderation allows teachers to collectively discuss results and come to shared understandings of student achievement.

Thank you to our P & C who have offered to cater for around 40 educators coming together.

Dear Parents, students & school community,


