PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – WEEK 3

Hello everyone,

It's a privilege to be leading Pingelly Primary School this term, and I'm really looking forward to meeting you all over the coming weeks. I hope you're feeling well-informed about the recent changes at our school, but if you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to get in touch. I really enjoy meeting parents and caregivers, and I want to ensure I can give you my full attention. To make the most of our conversation, please book a time through the office to meet with me.

I'd like to take this opportunity to share a few key strategies I use as Principal to build strong relationships with students and their families.

Behaviour Cards

We understand that students sometimes need extra support with their decision-making, particularly when facing challenges both inside and outside of school. One effective strategy we use is the Behaviour Card. This tool helps us "catch kids being good" by providing timely feedback, setting a clear goal, and offering a daily check-in with the Principal. If your child is placed on a Behaviour Card, you will be notified and receive a copy each day. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions. The aim is to provide positive reinforcement and help students make thoughtful, independent choices.

Intent to Suspend

When a student displays concerning behaviour, it can be helpful for them to reflect on their actions and consider better choices moving forward. An Intent to Suspend serves as a formal warning that further incidents may lead to suspension and you will be notified if your child is placed on Intent to Suspend. This status remains in place for four weeks, giving students a fair opportunity to reflect, reset, and avoid escalation.

Public School Review

Our Public School Review is scheduled for Thursday, 15 May 2025. Reviewers will focus on progress made since the 2024 recommendations, particularly in the areas of Leadership and Teaching Quality. Having successfully led my previous school through a one-year return review, I'm confident in our preparation. I'd also like to acknowledge Ms Calligaro, who has been working diligently this term to ensure we meet the required standards.

Social Emotional Wellbeing Survey

Throughout Week 3, teachers and education assistants will be conducting our annual Social Emotional and Wellbeing Survey with students. This survey provides valuable insights for Wheatbelt schools on how we can best support your child's social and emotional needs. Dental Van



It's that time of year again when the dental van is coming to visit Pingelly PS, we will be starting at the school on Friday 13th June and will commence seeing patients that week.

If your child is enrolled in the service you can expect (or may have received) an appointment letter, we do endeavour to book siblings in at the same time but occasionally siblings are separated, if you have received multiple appointments and would like them together please call the staff at the dental van and we will make every effort to accommodate this.

We do encourage parents to attend the first appointment (in this case please sign in/out through the admin office) as even if the child has previously been seen in our service we still require medical history's to be either updated or a new history taken, and other paperwork completed, as well as if your child requires dental treatment its often easier to discuss in person and to gain written consent.

If you are UNABLE to attend the first appointment please call the dental van staff (Kay and Kaz, Ph: 0437 202 882) before the appointment and advise us that you wish for us to collect your child from class (in this case we will send paperwork home with your child, so please check their backpack).

Please return paperwork ASAP either by dropping in to the van or alternatively it can be given to your child's teacher or front office staff.

If your child attends your family dentist please call dental van staff (0437202882) before the appointment. Finally we are looking forward to seeing you all and visiting the lovely town of Pingelly. See you soon! Kay and Kaz.
