Kitchen Garden Update with the year 3/4's

We are excited to share progress on our Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden, funded through our recent grant! We have also received a wonderful collection of gardening textbooks to help link our gardening activities to the curriculum.

Work has begun on the boundary fence and shade house, and in the process, we've uncovered the many layers of Pingelly soil and even glimpses into the history of classrooms past! A huge thank you to Dirk Christ, who volunteered alongside Miss Lowrie to install the first section of fencing poles.

We hope to have a labourer join us soon to complete the installation safely and efficiently. Once the poles are in place, we will be seeking volunteers to help attach the horse fencing — we'll need people with either staple guns or hammers. We will also begin planning the gable roof for the shade house.... We would LOVE your help! If you are interested in being involved with this space, please contact the school.

The final result will be an inspirational outdoor learning space, blending traditional Indigenous and Western foods for cooking experiences, Crunch and Sip, and hands-on garden learning. We can't wait to share it with

our students and the wider school community!

BUSH TUCKER GARDEN

Our Pingelly Primary Bushtucker Garden is bursting into life! Students have planted more than 160 native plants — from bush fruits that we'll soon be turning into delicious jams, to hardy species that will help shape and protect our growing garden spaces. Each week, our young gardeners can be found happily digging holes, planting seedlings, and carefully watering their work. They're learning how native plants connect to Country, provide food, and support our local ecosystem.

At the heart of the garden, we're planning something truly special — a Yarning Circle, a calm and welcoming space where students and community can gather to share stories, learn from one another, and reflect. To bring it to life, we're seeking help from anyone who can donate or assist with sourcing natural wooden logs for seating and structure.

This project isn't just about plants — it's about connection, care, and community. Every shovel of soil brings us one step closer to a living classroom that celebrates sustainability and the wisdom of Country.
