WHAT WE'VE BEEN UP TO LATELY ...

Outdoor Classroom experiences offer kindergarten children rich opportunities to learn through movement, exploration, and play. Being outside supports their physical development as they climb, balance, dig, run, and build strength and coordination in natural ways. It also nurtures curiosity and problem-solving as children investigate plants, insects, weather, and natural materials. Social skills grow as they collaborate, negotiate roles, and work together on shared challenges. Time outdoors can also enhance wellbeing by reducing stress, supporting self-regulation, and giving children space to feel calm and connected to nature.

We have loved our outdoor learning, and have appreciated our parents who have been able to come in and help us. Some highlights for us have been exploring more and less through bean bag tossing, making wind catchers, our balloon rocket races, following and describing a sequence to make and decorate sandcastles, completing surveys, making kites, making and testing boats, and parachute games.




