Health

If your child is unwell, it is advisable to keep him/her at home to recover. If your child requires medical attention or needs prescribed medication, please see the front office to complete the required forms for staff to administer the medication. We are an allergy aware school, please do not supply any foods which contain nuts.

Reporting

Reporting on your child's progress is done both formally and informally throughout the year.

Formal reports are provided each semester at the end of Term Two and Term Four.

Informal reporting is carried out through parent meetings, seesaw and class work sent home throughout the year.

If you would like to discuss your child's progress in detail please make an appointment with your child's teacher. Please be mindful that before class and during class the teacher is preparing or delivering the teaching and learning program and is unable to give you her undivided attention. Making an appointment enables the teacher to be more thorough and accurate.
